

One-Star / Two-Star / Three-Star Signature Membership

West Texas Watercolor Society (WTWS) Signature Membership honors a demonstrated record of acceptance into three Signature Member Shows beginning with the 2023 Signature Fall Show; and/or any WTWS Signature Exhibit thereafter. Only members who have achieved such status and recognition may use the Signature level Society's initials *WTWS* behind their signatures on their artwork. Each applicant for Signature Membership must furnish the Signature Membership Committee with dates of shows and titles of artworks accepted into WTWS Signature Shows for documentation to be verified. <u>Dues must be paid annually to maintain this membership status.</u>

One-Star Membership is achieved by any member whose paintings have been accepted and exhibited in **one** WTWS Signature Show.

Two-Star Membership is achieved by any member whose paintings have been accepted and exhibited in *two* Signature Show exhibitions.

Three-Star Signature Membership is achieved by any member whose paintings have been accepted and exhibited in *three* Signature Show exhibitions.

Master Status: The 10th appearance by a member in an WTWS Signature Exhibition signifies a mastery of the art of water media, and designation of Master Signature Status. Only members who have achieved such status and recognition may use WTWS -M, the Master level Society's initials.






